# Australian Curriculum; Humanities & Social Sciences (V 8.3 2016)

The Australian Curriculum: Humanities & Social Sciences is organised into four sub-strands:

• Geography, History, Civics & Citizenship and Economics & Business

These are each organised into two interrelated strands:

- Knowledge & Understanding
- Inquiry & Skills

The Civics & Citizenship Knowledge & Understanding sub-strand comprises three key focus areas at each year level:

- Government & democracy;
- Laws & citizens and
- · Citizenship, diversity and identity.

Government & democracy involves a study of Australian democracy and the key institutions, processes and roles people play in Australia's system of government.

The Civics & Citizenship <u>Inquiry & skills</u> strand focuses on the skills of questioning, research, analysis, <u>evaluating & reflecting</u> and communicating.




