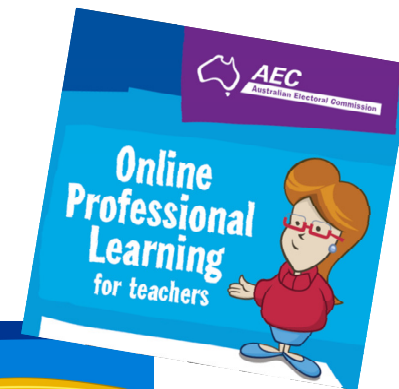
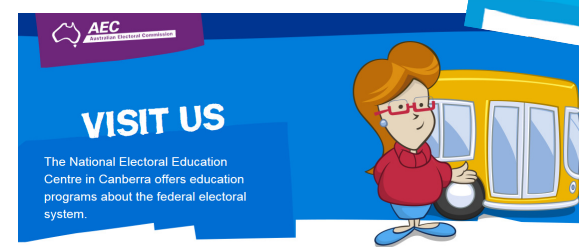
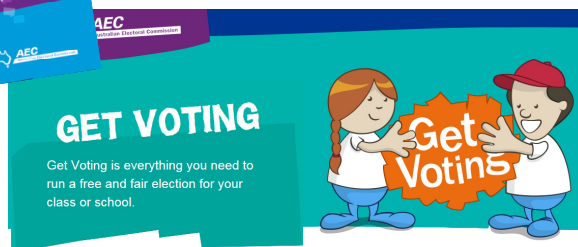

The Australian Curriculum: Humanities & Social Sciences is organised into four sub-strands:

- Geography, History, Civics & Citizenship and Economics & Business

These are each organised into two interrelated strands:

- Knowledge & Understanding
- Inquiry & Skills

The Civics & Citizenship Knowledge & Understanding sub-strand comprises three key focus areas at each year level:

- Government & democracy;
- Laws & citizens and
- Citizenship, diversity and identity.

Government & democracy involves a study of Australian democracy and the key institutions, processes and roles people play in Australia's system of government.

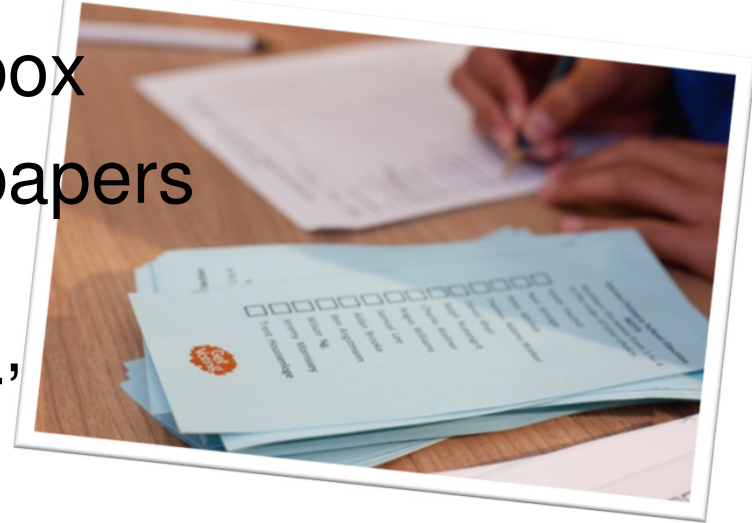
The Civics & Citizenship Inquiry & skills strand focuses on the skills of questioning, research, analysis, evaluating & reflecting and communicating.

Election Scenario

'As part of our healthy eating program we are going to make a decision about a what 'healthy' food we will all have for a snack next week'.

'As there are several 'candidates' involved, as a voter, you will have to decide on the order of the snack that you 'prefer'. So, your first choice snack will be number 1, second choice number 2 etc. until all candidates are numbered'.

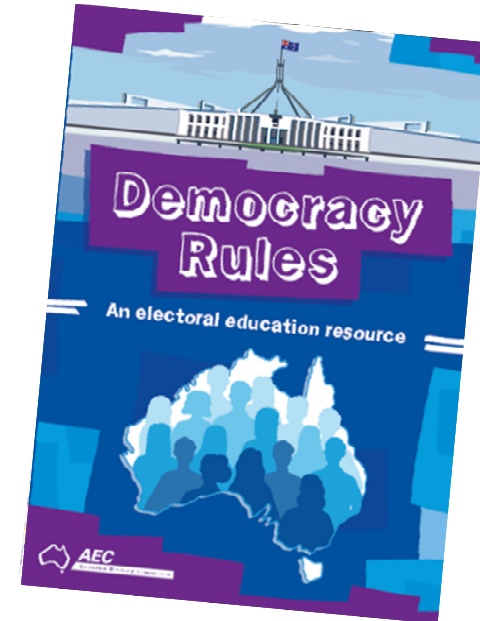

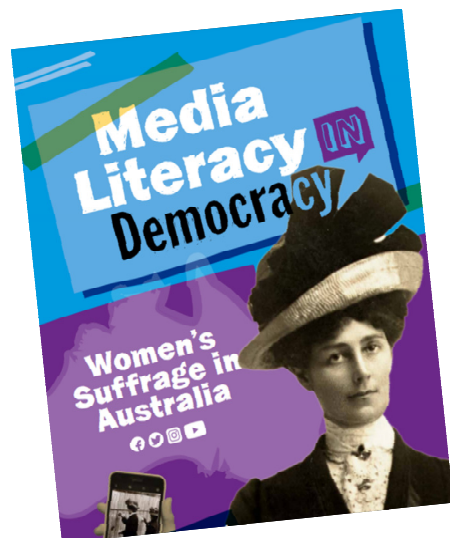
